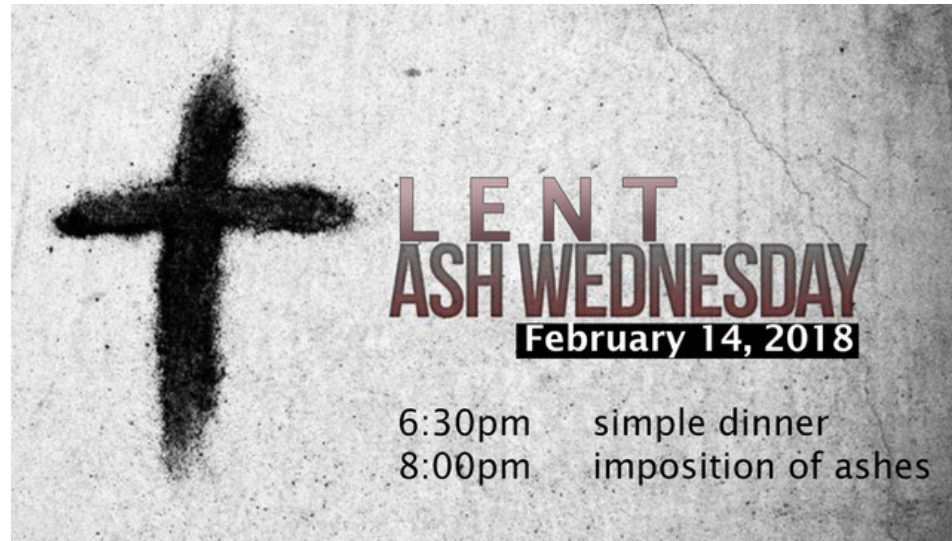
Lenten 2018 Small Groups: Tending the Garden of Relationships
