As our program year finishes up, I find that I am both gratefully awed by the things God has done among us and with us, but also excited for the road ahead.

Since September we continued to live out and make real God's vision for TriCon church to be "a nurturing community of faith that honors God through service and mission."

We nurtured community in the redesigned Children's Ministry, bringing different age groups together in the classrooms, worshiping together in the sanctuary and facilitating new adult volunteers to share their skills and talents with the children. The Voyagers, Seekers, Youth Group and Discussion Group continued to thrive under the leadership of Carrie O'Brien, Rev. Dr. Jean Vandergrift and our new Youth Leader, Christine Kelley.

The Youth Mission Trip, dinner and worship service was transformative for all of us and in May we confirmed 27 freshman and sophomores.

The Stewardship Committee innovated a new program that engaged many of us in pie parties, small group discussions about the value and worth of TriCon and how we together fund the vision. These gatherings were very well received by many and plans are already underway for more stewardship pie parties this October.

The Social Action Committee spearheaded this past year's *Mission Sunday Service*, then we took our worship to the street as more than 100 of us, including men, women and children of all ages processed and participated in the *Crop Walk To End Hunger*. Most of us proudly sported our TriCon baseball caps, creating a sea of grey hats, honoring God through service and mission.

Christian Education continued to organize our small group ministries during Advent and Lent, producing customized content to focus all of us during the holy seasons, while nurturing both spirituality and community. Also, a Diaconate sub-committee worked with Jean Vandergrift to create an easy to follow roadmap for starting new small groups at TriCon.

The Diaconate also invited many of you to talk personally about your worship experience at TriCon in one on one conversation. The information gained in these thought-provoking interviews was compiled and analyzed to give us a clearer picture of our vibrant and relevant worship experience. The results will be distributed soon throughout the church.

A special search committee was formed in the Summer to identify who God is calling to be our settled Minister for Congregational Life. They worked tirelessly for nine months and in the end presented us with Rev. Gail Miller. We enthusiastically affirmed that call last month at a special congregational meeting and anticipate Gail beginning her ministry with us in August.

Now, after a little over 2 years, it's time to say farewell to Rev. Dr. Jean Vandergrift. Jean has been invaluable during our transition period. Her specialized ministry was more than just interim work. She ministered to all of us with care, compassion and integrity. We are a better church because of her time with us. Personally, I will greatly miss her collaboration, insight and creativity, yet I know that her work at TriCon must come to an end so that she can bring her substantial skills to wherever God calls her next.

There were so many other great things that happened at TriCon Church these past nine months. For a real comprehensive view, find Bob Lawson's musical video on our web page. It is a masterpiece that will make you smile.



I feel sadness as the day approaches because I will miss each one of you. Thank you for letting me in as your pastor and friend; I cherish the relationships we have built!



- having had a clergy colleague of integrity in Bob and learning more about God’s grace because he *lives* it!









From the Search Committee for
MINISTER OF CONGREGATIONAL LIFE

The Search Committee unanimously and enthusiastically endorsed calling Rev. Gail Miller as our Minister of Congregational Life.

Originally from the Midwest, Gail grew up in Wisconsin and went to St. Olaf College in Minnesota. She attended Luther Theological Seminary in Minneapolis, always remaining a Congregationalist. She was ordained at a UCC church in Minnesota in 1994.

Gail is a strong communicator, extremely organized and is clear with her goals. Her leadership style is by example and she collaborates well with both clergy and lay leaders. She brings God's presence to everything and with everyone she engages.

Currently the sole pastor at Union Congregational Church in Groton, Gail, her husband Mike Smith and their daughter, Sophia (15) live in Maynard and enjoy skiing, musical theater, and adventure travel.

Minutes of the Congregational Meeting
12 May 2019

Immediately after the worship service, Moderator Russell Sanna called the Congregational Meeting to order. He explained that the purpose of the meeting was that which was stated in the Warrant: To receive and act upon the recommendation of the Search Committee for the Minister of Congregational Life.

Russell then asked Paul Mahoney of the Search Committee to report on the Committee's recommendation. Paul briefly explained the process used by the Committee in its discernment and deliberations and called on four members of the Committee to speak about four criteria they used to evaluate candidates and how Rev. Miller fully fulfilled and met all criteria. Susanne Giles talked about Spirituality; Lucas Wilbur about Children's and Youth ministry; Prescott Stewart about Leadership and Charity Tremblay about Pastoral Care.

Upon hearing the Search Committee's recommendation, Russell asked for a motion to accept the recommendation of the Search Committee. Said motion was made and seconded. There was no discussion. A Voice Vote was taken and the Ayes had it; the motion to call Rev. Gail Miller to be TriCon's Minister of Congregational Life was carried.

Rev. Miller was given the results of the affirming vote and brought into the meeting. She made brief comments and explained that in the August timeframe, she will begin to get started at TriCon.

There was no further business to come before the Congregational Meeting, therefore, a motion was made, seconded, and carried to adjourn.



Each year at Christmas and Easter, volunteers decorate the church with special floral displays. We would like to create a **Flower Committee** that would continue that tradition and also be available, on



Respect, Responsibility, and a Path Forward

Communities for Restorative Justice (C4RJ) is a growing nonprofit that partners with 24 cities and towns, their police departments, and the District Attorneys of Middlesex and Suffolk counties to rebuild trust and offer a path forward in the wake of crime.

C4RJ listens to victims, holds offenders accountable, and restores trust in communities. Their volunteer-led "circle" dialogue is called restorative justice. It's personal. It's powerful. And it's why C4RJ is a proven, effective option within the justice system.

How does your TriCon donation work?
Restorative justice costs communities approximately six times less than criminal prosecution or repeat crimes. **So, for every \$1 invested in C4RJ, communities and society save about \$6.**
